The World Meeting of Families and the Papal Visit which took place in August highlighted some of the best experiences of faith and also raised debates about the many issues that we must face as a Church. During the World Meeting of Families in the RDS so many families of all ages and configurations came together to celebrate and be nourished in their faith. The discussions, forums and times of worship created great bonds between those who took part. There were many people from our Parish who took part in the choirs, as ministers of the Eucharist, stewards as well as our Altar Servers who played a key role.



In the various aspects of Pope Francis' visit he met with many groups including Young Couples in the Pro-Cathedral, those who attend the Capuchin Day Centre, those who gathered in the rain in Knock, the President and Government, the Irish Bishops and the survivors of abuse by individuals and institutions of the Church. This group had a profound effect on him which was reflected in the Penitential Rite which he wrote for the Papal Mass and on returning to Rome calling the heads of the Bishop's conferences from around the world to gather in Rome to face the issue of Abuse.

The events of August were an important time for us and the goal from the beginning was for the Church to meet the costs of the events. While the four national collections received a generous response and the tickets fees and other sponsorship met another amount of the costs, there is a deficit of $\epsilon 4m$.

Next weekend there will be a fifth national collection to address this. It will replace the SHARE



collection at all Masses and we ask if you can as generous to this collection as you have been to the four that have taken place. If you are in a position to give some extra, it would be appreciated.

Harvest Thanksgiving

Last week the pupils from St. Cronan's Junior School had their Harvest Thanksgiving and Opening of the School Year Prayer Service. Each pupil brought in a non-perishable item of food and placed it around the Sanctuary. It filled the three steps and more! A big thank you to all the boys and girls.

Later that day two 6th classes who are preparing for Confirmation came over to sort all the foods into categories and pack them into crates. They worked very well together and had the job done in 40mins. They filled 40 crates with the food.

Included in this was the food that Parishioners brought to the weekend Masses.

The theme of our Prayer Service was Thank You. It focused on thanking God for the foods that we eat, the people who grow and manufacture them and those who cook them for us. We also reflected on the sharing of food with all people and of using the environment wisely because the Earth is our common home.

All the food gathered was brought over to the North County Foodbank which is operated from the Old Parish Meeting Room by Crosscare.

As soon as we walked into the Church at the weekend and especially for the Harvest Service we were prepared because of the beautiful flowers that Maura had arranged. There is something really beautiful about the autumn colours that bring the Church alive.

Our Harvest Thanksgiving is an important part of our practice. Even though for many years it was more associated with the Church of Ireland, it is a time to reflect on our connection with the earth as God's gift which nourishes and sustains our lives. The changing climate has brought many challenges to food production and cycles that were once predictable have changed. The earth is our common home and as Christians we have a responsibility to look after it and the people who live on it. Climate Justice and Social Justice are the same thing. We are called to make a difference even in the practice of reducing-reusing-

recycling. Another is to reduce the amount of plastics we use and lobby our shops to provide paper bags instead of plastic. These may seem small things, but change has to begin from the bottom upwards!

Journeying the Liturgical Year

Every 31st of December many get ready to celebrate the moment the clock strikes midnight and a new year dawns. Countless people take on the task of a New Years' Resolution with the purpose of bettering themselves, or to make the year ahead more meaningful. Imagine that we did the same for the new church year - we purposely decided to journey the year from a faith perspective, to connect with the key moments, to build our relationship with Jesus,



and to make the year more meaningful. Sounds great, however, where would one even begin? Are we assuming everyone in the parish knows the new Liturgical Year commences on the First Sunday of Advent?

Consciously journeying the year gives us many opportunities to stop, reflect and broaden our faith. It provides us with an opportunity to not only see what happens at various times of the year, but contemplate the vital, yet rarely asked question of 'why?'. There can be a belief that because someone attends Mass and received the Sacraments for most of their lives, they have full knowledge of the liturgy,

liturgical space, and feast days. I don't think we can rightly presume this. After the Sacrament of Confirmation, what parish-based faith formation is available for adults? The Mass and liturgical seasons aid us to deepen our relationship with Jesus, but only if we know how to engage. Connection with faith changes throughout life as a person matures. Education aside, what forum have we, the church, provided for people to engage in 'why' questions?


