#### REMEMBERING THOSE AWAY THIS CHRISTMAS

## Consecrated Life In Today's Church - Gospel, Prophecy, Hope

Earlier this year, Pope Francis decided to proclaim a **Year of Consecrated Life** on the occasion of the fiftieth anniversary of the Dogmatic Constitution on the Church Lumen Gentium and on the renewal of religious life. The opening of this year began on the First Sunday of Advent and will continue until  $2^{\rm nd}$  February 2016.

In his opening message Pope Francis said..."I invite every Christian community to experience this Year above all as a moment of thanksgiving to the Lord and grateful remembrance for all the gifts we continue to receive."

The Logo, designed for the Year of Consecrated Life, expresses through symbols the fundamental values of consecrated life. In it we recognise the "unceasing work of the Holy Spirit, who in every age shows forth the richness of the practice of the evangelical counsels through a multiplicity of charisms. In this way too he makes ever present in the Church and in the world, in time and space, the mystery of Christ." (VC5).

Pope Francis has challenged all religious but also the laity, to live this year in a spirit of Joy and outlined the Aims of the Year: Look to the past with gratitude; Live the present with passion; Embrace the future with hope.

"You have not only a glorious history to remember and to recount, but also a great history still to be accomplished! Look to the future, where the Spirit is sending you in order to do even greater things".
