9th May 2021 Sixth Sunday of Easter Year B

It is with great joy that we welcome people back to Mass from Monday 10th May. We are very grateful for all the messages of support and kindness over the past few months while we have been online, knowing that we were joined together in prayer and will continue to be until things are fully restored.

Archbishop Farrell in welcoming the Government announcement about the reopening has also been clear that we have to be extra vigilant with our safety procedures. We are the only group that has been allowed to have people gathering inside and the reason for this is the good practice that we had in place the last time we were open.

Many of you will have been vaccinated and as I have seen in talking with you, greater peace of mind and confidence comes with this. There is also a growing feeling that we are in the last days of the pandemic. While there are great signs of hope we are far from the end of this and we have to be extra careful, particularly in coming to Church.

Please follow these guidelines as we gather together again:

- You must wear a facemask covering your nose and mouth
- Sanitise your hands when entering and leaving the Church
- Follow the advice of the steward in directing you to a seat and once seated please do not move around the church.
- The church is divided into two pods each holding up to 45 people. There is no crossing from one pod to the
- For the time being congregational singing is not permitted.
- Holy Communion will be brought to you in your seat and this is the only time you can remove your face mask.
- At the end of Mass please remain in your seat until the steward asks you to leave.
- Please do not gather in groups outside the Church.
- If you wish to attend Mass in your car in the Carpark, please let the door steward know and a Eucharistic Minister will come to you at Communion time.
- If you wish to join us for Mass on the webcam you can come to the Church for Holy Communion after the Mass.
- Baptism: dates for Baptism in June have gone up on the website and while most are now booked, there are a couple still available. At the Baptism it is only the parents, godparents, siblings of the baby and grandparents who have been vaccinated who can attend.
- First Holy Communion and Confirmation: thesis will happen later in the year. Dates will not be set until Archbishop Farrell give the go ahead and we will endeavour to give families one months notice.
- Funerals: can have 50 mourners
- Weddings: can have 50 present (this includes the bride, groom and two witnesses)
- Confession: this continues from 10:45am until 11:30am in the Pastoral Centre on Saturday morning.
- Arrangements for First Confession will be looked at over the next couple of weeks.
- Adoration: we will look at the provision of Adoration in June.

It is great that we are back to being able to pray in person together but we have to work together to keep each other safe and to bring this pandemic to an end. Pope Francis has asked us to pray the rosary each day this month and as we do so to remember in a particular way the peoples of India and South America where the pandemic is at frightening levels. Let our prayer and solidarity give us hope that the light of Jesus shines through this darkness and the darkness cannot overpower it.
