PAYMENTS BY CARD

We are delighted to announce that we have partnered with Payzone Ireland to provide all parishes with a facility to accept card payments from their website. This partnership is a big step forward in combating the decline in Mass collections and we would urge all parishes to get involved. This new facility will allow our parishioners to contribute both on an adhoc basis or on a fixed automated payment schedule. Parishes will also have the added benefit of being able to use their websites to take payments for other events or fundraising activities. As the use of cash declines in society the Church needs to embrace new technologies, and this is our first step to that end. We have worked closely with Payzone to develop a solution to meet our collective needs and have

SIGN OF PEACE

The sign of peace is an important moment in the Mass to express our solidarity, community and being brothers and sisters in Jesus Christ. The gesture of shaking hands with our neighbour is common practice in our society. However there may be circumstances where this is not as straightforward for some people eg: arthritis, skin conditions or injury. Also in this flu season some people feel vulnerable to infection and avoid shaking hands with others.

It is common practice here for people to use another form of the sign of peace like a nod or bow to their neighbour or a simple smile. This is respected by those around them and should you prefer to adopt one of these gestures when the Priest says "Let us offer one another a sign of peace," this is a way to express the peace of Christ.

At each of our doors we also provide anti-bacterial hand wash for you to use entering and leaving the Church. Our Ministers of the Eucharist also use a hand wash before distributing Holy Communion and if they have a cold or flu they get someone else to cover them.

The Dublin Diocese is in contact with the Public Health Office of the Department of Health and follows the advice that is provided.
