## THE BLESSING OF THE HOLY OILS

Behind the celebrant's chair is a container with the Holy Oils used in the celebration of the Sacraments in the Parish during the year. On Holy Thursday two of them are blessed and the third is consecrated at the Chrism Mass in the Pro-Cathedral. When they are used throughout the Diocese in the Sacrament of Baptism, Confirmation and Anointing of the Sick, there is a spiritual link with all those who receive these Sacraments and the Bishop of the Diocese. In this way the bonds of communion between us are strengthened, we are not a Christian alone in the world, but one who belongs to a family through the Parish and the Diocese.

There are three different oils that we use. Each of them is made with the purest, first press, olive oil. They are stored in a secure place in the church and the oil of the sick (Infirmorum) is carried by Priests in an Oil Stock.

The Oil of Infirmorum: is used when someone is ill to celebrate the Sacrament of the Sick. The practice of the anointing of the sick has a tradition going back to the very beginning of the Church. It is encouraged that this Sacrament should be celebrated as a community, as we did during the retreat. In this way those who are sick are supported by the prayers of all the community.

This oil is also used as someone is approaching death. With the final reception of the Eucharist (Viaticum), Confession and the Anointing, it prepares those who are getting ready for their journey home to God, to enter into God's presence. It is encouraged that this Sacrament is celebrated when the person is able to appreciate what is happening. For many it gives them comfort and eases the anxiety that leaving their family brings. It is always available on request from the Priests of the Parish.

The Oil of Catechumen is used only in the Sacrament of Baptism. Once the person to be baptized has asked for the Sacrament, or it has been requested on their behalf by their parents, the word of God has been heard and responded to with prayers of intercession, then the anointing takes place. In the Baptism Ceremony it is called the Rite of Exorcism. What this means is that by this anointing God's presence with the person will keep them out of the path of the evil one. The anointing signifies in a tangible way that this person is now welcomed into God's family, the Church.

The Oil of Chrism is the one which is consecrated on Holy Thursday. To this oil is added the perfume Balsam which when it is used can be clearly smelt, a sweet perfume. The oil of Chrism is very important as it signifies our being joined to Christ in Baptism through the Holy Spirit when we are anointed. Again at the Sacrament of Confirmation we are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit as the Bishop or his delegate, traces the sign of the cross on the forehead. In this sign we are full members of the Church and share in the Priesthood of Jesus Christ. When a Priest is Ordained to the Sacramental Ministry his hands are anointed with the Oil of Chrism, that he may live his life in the pattern of Jesus' ministry. These oils, unlike other blessed oils are for the celebration of the Sacraments. In each of the Sacraments we meet Jesus in the particular circumstance that we find ourselves. He reminds us and the Church through these touches that He is with us always, to the very end of time.

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## AN EASTER MESSAGE FROM POPE FRANCIS

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Dear Brothers and Sisters, a Happy and Holy Easter!

The Church throughout the world echoes the angel's message to the women: "Do not be afraid! I know that you are looking for Jesus who was crucified. He is not here; for he has been raised... Come, see the place where he lay" ( Mt 28:5-6).

This is the culmination of the Gospel, it is the Good News par excellence: Jesus, who was crucified, is risen! This event is the basis of our faith and our hope. If Christ were not raised, Christianity would lose its very meaning; the whole mission of the Church would lose its impulse, for this is the point from which it first set out and continues to set out ever anew. The message which Christians bring to the world is this: Jesus, Love incarnate, died on the cross for our sins, but God the Father raised him and made him the Lord of life and death. In Jesus, love has triumphed over hatred, mercy over sinfulness, goodness over evil, truth over falsehood, life over death.

This is why we tell everyone: "Come and see!" In every human situation, marked by frailty, sin and death, the Good News is no mere matter of words, but a testimony to unconditional and faithful love: it is about leaving ourselves behind and encountering others, being close to those crushed by life's troubles, sharing with the needy, standing at the side of the sick, elderly and the outcast... "Come and see!": Love is more powerful, love gives life, love makes hope blossom in the wilderness.

With this joyful certainty in our hearts, today we turn to you, risen Lord!

Help us to seek you and to find you, to realize that we have a Father and are not orphans; that we can love and adore you.

Help us to overcome the scourge of hunger, aggravated by conflicts and by the immense wastefulness for which we are often responsible.

Enable us to protect the vulnerable, especially children, women and the elderly, who are at times exploited and abandoned.

Comfort all those who cannot celebrate this Easter with their loved ones because they have been unjustly torn from their affections, like the many persons, priests and laity, who in various parts of the world have been kidnapped.

Comfort those who have left their own lands to migrate to places offering hope for a better future and the possibility of living their lives in dignity and, not infrequently, of freely professing their faith.

We ask you, Lord Jesus, to put an end to all war and every conflict, whether great or small, ancient or recent.

Lord, we pray to you for all the peoples of the earth: you who have conquered death, grant us your life, grant us your peace! Dear brothers and sisters, Happy Easter!
