The Feast of the Holy Family is dedicated to the Holy Family of Jesus, Mary and Joseph, commemorating their life together in Nazareth and calling us to focus on Catholic family life.

The Church presents the Holy Family to us as a model for our own family life. The parents of Jesus would have taught him the Scriptures and prayers of their people when he was very young. It was through their example that Jesus would formulate many of the stories he would later use in his teaching. Jesus saw work sanctified through the example of his earthly parents, who did all things well in the ordinary circumstances of daily life.


As far back as St. John Chrysostom, Christians were urged to make of their home a *family church* in which the family members would find ways of being holy. That was to be accomplished by putting Christ at the centre of all individual and family life, by working and praying together, reading the Scriptures and worshiping as a unit.

Catholics are encouraged to learn what the Church teaches about family life. It is within the family that human life in all its stages is nurtured and protected, where concern for others is learned and where the virtues are developed for the good of the individual, the family, and of society.

#### **FAMILY OFFERING & COLLECTIONS AT WEEKEND MASSES**

We thank all those parishioners who support the running of the parish through the Parish Family Offering fund. As the newsletters have been printed before the Christmas break, we will publish the amounts of the Christmas Collections in mid-January.

If you pay tax and you contribute more than €250 to the Parish in a calendar year, this then enables the Parish to reclaim the tax paid on your contributions. Your Christmas Dues offering can be included as part of the €250 base figure. Unfortunately, the Revenue now only allow this if the name of the primary tax payer in the family is included on the Dues envelope. For instance a married couple, Michael and Mary Murphy, with Mary being the primary tax payer. We wouldn't be allowed to include the Murphy offering if their Dues envelope was only in the name of Michael Murphy. The ideal is to include both names, Michael and Mary Murphy, to be sure of inclusion in the tax reclaim. Also allowable would be the Murphy Family or Mary Murphy. Single or widowed contributors are not affected as their Dues offering will be in their own name anyhow. Thank you to all who contribute so generously to the Dues offerings, it is very much appreciated. Parish Finance Committee.




