Each year we begin this journey in September, but the length of the time that each individual spends preparing is down to them and the team who accompany them. Earlier in the year when we gave an account of the Parish finances we also pointed towards the next project that needs to be undertaken which is the redecoration and refurbishment of the

It is over 10 years since the Church was painted and as you look around you can see that it is now time to attend to this. We also need to replace the benches and Altar Furniture as well as other works around the Church.

The plan has been split into two phases the first of which we hope to complete by Christmas this year and the second by Christmas

Phase One: repainting the Church, Pastoral Centre and Sacristy. Upgrade the Altar, Ambo, Chair and ancillary sanctuary furniture. Carpet the Sanctuary. New noticeboards for the porches and literature racks inside the Church. Put proper opening mechanisms on the Church windows. Attend to the Church roof. New signage outside the Church and Pastoral Centre. Refurbishment of the Sacristy.

We are currently seeking quotes for the above works.

Phase Two: replace the Church seating and carpet the Church. Next week we will have further details of Phase One with an image of what the Sanctuary Furniture will look like. We welcome your feedback, as it is on your behalf these works are being carried out. 

The Image of Messiah

'Messiah' is one of many titles given to Jesus in New Testament writings. 'Christ' is sometimes mistakenly thought to be a family name for Jesus. It is, in fact, a significant title that Jesus used to identify himself, and it tells us who the first Christians thought Jesus was. In Jewish history, Messiah was a title preserved for the one who would be the ideal leader of the Israelites. The Jews believed God would send them a messiah to lead Israel to national greatness.

The Hebrew title Messiah pointed to 'the anointed one' as the one chosen by God. Because the Israelites thought their ideal ruler would be a king, they asked the Judge, Samuel, to find a king 'to govern us'. Samuel prayed to the Lord and the Lord said to Samuel, 'Listen to their voice and set a king over them' (1 Sm. 8:22). Samuel chose Saul to be the first Israelite king. He took a vial of oil and poured it on Saul's head, saying, 'The



Lord has anointed you to rule over his people Israel. You will save them from the hand of their enemies all around them.' (1 Sm. 10:1)

How was the title Messiah for Jesus preserved and handed on to Christians in the decades after Jedeath-resurrection? First, they were handed on through the preaching of the apostles and disciples. The community proclaimed Jesus 'the Christ' shortly after his death-resurrection. Later, other titles were added through preaching and church prayers, including hymns.
