This weekend 22/23rd October we begin our week of thanksgiving for the providence and goodness of the Lord in our lives. When we look at the world around us there is so much upheaval in Haiti following the natural disaster, in

Syria and particularly in its capital Aleppo where there has been so much loss of life especially among the young, in the lives of those who have fled their homes and homelands. Closer to home we continue to face the plight of so many who are homeless, those in emergency accommodation and many living on or below the poverty line. In recent times there has also been an increase in racial attacks both verbal and physical as the political realities have changed and these voices have emerged.

It is against all of these shades of darkness that we need to look for light, for hope and for the presence of God. Each Sunday that we celebrate the Eucharist we come together to give thanks for the presence and action of God in our lives and throughout history. Giving thanks for the small things in our lives helps us to recognise the place of God in the bigger things in our lives. Thankfulness leads us to hope and being people of hope guides us to help others both as individuals and as a community to bring light into the darkness of peoples lives.

In this week of thanksgiving you are invited to write something you are thankful for (on a yellow post it) in your life and place it on our prayer tree (between the Divine Mercy Shrine and St. Francis Shrine) and also to pray for a person or situation where there is a difficulty (on an orange post it), either close to home or the situations mentioned above.



FOOD DRIVE

On Wednesday the children in St. Cronan's Junior School will have their Harvest Thanksgiving where they will bring an item of non-perishable food to be used in the local Crosscare Foodbank. Their response to this is always amazing.

Next weekend we ask you to bring some non-perishable foods and place them around the Altar. These will also be passed on to the local Crosscare Foodbank. (In Advent the Archbishop will have a Diocesan wide food drive **but we do it NOW** in order that the long established food drive by the Lions Club for the St. Vincent de Paul is not affected.)

Bringing an offering to the Mass next weekend is both an expression of thanks and a response to God's call to look after those in need. At the very heart of the year of Mercy have been the Corporal Works of Mercy which ask us to feed the hungry, give a drink to the thirsty, clothe the naked etc. As we come to the end of the Jubilee of Mercy let us make a special effort to contribute to this food drive.



Family Mass

The 12:30pm Mass on a Sunday just isn't the same without the involvement of the children and their families in the Liturgy. It was right that the Family Mass Team who had prepared the Mass for the last 12 – 15 years decided to step down. They got



involved so that their children could take part in an active way in the Sunday Mass and at the special Liturgical Seasons during the year.

I really feel that it is important that we have a family Mass where children are involved, where teenagers share the word of God and where families feel comfortable to bring younger children. Over the next two Sundays I am going to make an appeal for new members for the Family Mass Team. There will be forms at the back of the Church and Peter or a member of the Pastoral Council will be there to take the names.

In reality we need 8 to 10 parents to get involved. You will be Garda Vetted by the Parish and while that is being done there will be a short training programme. If we get 8-10 parents they can be made into two teams who will alternate the months between them and come together for Christmas and Easter.

So I appeal to you, if you have young children who come to the 12:30 Mass, or who attend another Mass at the moment but would like a more child/family focussed Mass then please put your name down. The outgoing team spoke about how much they got out of their involvement over the years and I know that you will also. Please be open to giving it a go.

Our annual Mass takes place this year on Friday 4th November at 7:30pm. An invitation has been sent to every family to the person given as next of kin. If you have had a funeral in our Church during the year, but have not received an

invitation, please contact the Parish Office.

When the family arrive at the Church they will be given a candle with the name of their loved one on it and a wooden cross. During the ceremony of remembrance a member of the family present these to the sacred space on the sanctuary. At the end of the Mass they will be invited to take the candle home with a flower bulb, while the cross is placed on out remembrance board.

Families are invited to prepare a piece on their loved one for the Book of Remembrance which is available to look at in the Sacred Space beside the Organ. Please drop the piece on your loved one into the Parish Office

THE JUBILEE OF MERCY PILGRIMAGE TO THE **DIOCESAN DOOR OF MERCY**

There will be a visit to the 1916 exhibition in St. Kevin's Oratory which tells the story of the Church in Dublin during and after the Easter Rising.


