## ADVENT – PREPARE THE WAY OF THE LORD

Next Sunday is the beginning of Advent, our time of preparation for the celebration of the birth of Jesus. We have a number of events happening that will help us in our preparation.

**Blessing of Advent Wreath:** will take place during a prayer service at 6:00pm next Saturday 29<sup>th</sup> November, just before the evening Mass. We encourage those who attend the Saturday evening Mass to come along that little bit early and begin the season of preparation in prayer.

**Travelling Crib:** From after the Family Mass at 12:30pm on Sunday 30<sup>th</sup> November the Travelling Crib will begin its journey around the Parish, to return at the Family Mass at 6:00pm on Christmas Eve. This is very suitable for teaching children the meaning of Christmas and also gives a way of praying as a family together. ## OUR HIDE AND SEEK GOD

---

The Christian never wearies of listening to the story of the coming of Christ, of examining again the hints that God dropped into history before he was born of the Virgin Mary.

The story of God's coming amongst us in Christ reads like a child's game of hide and seek. In the history of our race it was humanity who hid from God. Adam and his wife hid themselves among the trees of the garden and for centuries afterwards humanity wandered around seeking the hiding place of God who had left in the beauty of this world so many clues of his presence.

Suddenly while all things were quiet and the night was in the midst of its course, God changed his hiding place. He came and hid in a little country town, came and hid in a cave, came and hid in the form of a child. The game of hide and seek was over.

Through the season of Advent the readings help us to retrace here our search for God and of God's search for us that ended in the joyful discovery of each other in the cave in Bethlehem. In the spirit of this season we pray: "When the world was dark and the city was quiet you came. You crept in beside us. And no one knew. Only the few who dared to believe that God might do something different. Will you do the same this Christmas, Jesus? Will you come into the darkness of today's world: not the friendly darkness as when sleep rescues us from tiredness, but the fearful darkness in which people have stopped believing that war will end or that food will come or that the government will change or that the church cares? Will you come into that darkness and do something different to save your people from death and despair? Will you come into the quietness of our towns, not the friendly quietness as when lovers hold hands but the fearful silence when the phone has not rung, the letter has not come, the friendly voice no longer speaks, the doctor's face says it all?"

We ask this because the fullness our lives long for depends on us being as open and vulnerable to you as you were to us, trusting human hands to hold their maker. Will you come into our lives if we open them to you, and do something different?"

God, our Father, through the power of the Holy Spirit, you sent your Son, Jesus Christ, to come as a little child to lead us on our Advent journey.

As we prepare this Advent for his coming again, open our hearts to the wonder of his Presence in our lives.

Heal our wounds, bless our endeavours and make us gentle of heart. Amen.
