PARISH FINANCE

This year we have been all faced with many financial challenges as increased charges are levied from us and the long awaited economic recovery is slow to make a difference in people's income. While there has



been a drop in contributions to support the Parish, your commitment to meeting the daily running costs and providing funds for the ongoing maintenance and development of the Parish Pastoral Centre is deeply appreciated.

During the year we had to change our Standing Orders from Danske Bank to Ulster Bank. We thank you for your patience and co-operation during the changeover. We hope that nearly all the issues have been resolved.

The only source of income that the Parish receives is from the Church Envelope and Standing Orders. The first collection at Mass and the Christmas and Easter Dues is to support the Priests, here and throughout the Diocese and the second collection at Mass is for the Diocesan Share Fund.

In February we will produce the statement of Accounts for the year. A summary of how our income has changed is: Total receipts from €182,938 to €169,247; a fall of 7.48% and Family Offering from €139,610 to €123,400; a fall of 11.61%.

In the New Year we will be launching a fundraising campaign to develop the Parish Pastoral Centre. While we have much of the funds built up thanks to your generosity we have a shortfall of around €50,000.00.

I would like to thank the members of the Finance Committee who advise and oversee the management of the Parish Monies and the collectors, counters and record keeper whose work is so important. Now that the Charities Commission is in operation we will have some minor changes in practice to implement. Most have already been done in how we keep records, issue receipts, use the pouches for the Mass collection etc.

Thank you again for your ongoing commitment and support. We hope that all our building and fundraising plans will run smoothly through the year.



PARISH PASTORAL CENTRE

Each year for the last three years we have been saying that we hope next year to bring the building of the Parish Pastoral Centre to completion. It is with great excitement that I can announce that on the 19th January 2015 the builders will move on site and by August the Centre will be completed.



The vision of this building has been held by many people over the years as they saw the need to upgrade the bathroom facilities, provide a place for people to meet for tea/coffee after Mass, particularly our senior Parishioners, during the week. There will be two meeting rooms and a new Parish Office. Through a process of consultation, presentation of the plans, contact with our neighbours and Fingal County Council we now have a plan that fulfills the needs of the Parish at this time. Earlier in the year we appointed James Ahern as our Architect and through a tender process he has recommended Duke Construction of Clanbrassil Street to do the building work.

I would like to thank the members of the Parish Pastoral Centre Development Group who have undertaken to see the project through the various stages to completion. Each one has brought a lot of wisdom to the various stages of design development.

We now look forward to seeing the building rise from the ground and Duke Construction have assured us that they will cause as a little disruption as possible to the daily activities in the Church.
