
Anyone who has booked a Mass and/or Coach Ticket for the Papal Mass with the Parish Office should hopefully be able to collect them from the Parish Office from Tuesday 14th August- 9:30am - 1pm. There is a fee of €10 per person to cover the cost of the coach and we ask that this be paid when you come to collect your ticket.

Please note there will be a walk of no further than 7km. Seating will not be provided in the Phoenix Park, however, portable seating will be allowed into the Park, so you are advised to bring a fold-up chair with you. More information on this and what else you can bring into the Park will be available soon please check the **WMOF2018** (www.worldmeeting2018.ie). There are also a range of facilities on site to help you on the day. Designated rest zones, food and drinks stations, medical facilities, as well as toilets and baby changing facilities are all at the Park, gates and transport hubs. There will also be volunteers throughout the Park and special facilities for people with accessibility issues and their carers.

## Papal Visit 25th & 26th August 2018 Changes to Mass Schedule

On the weekend of the 25<sup>th</sup> and 26<sup>th</sup> August there will be a different Mass Schedule to facilitate those attending the Papal Mass in the Phoenix Park and also to provide a gathering for those unable to attend.

On Saturday 25<sup>th</sup> the Vigil Mass will be a 6:30pm. On Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> there will be only one morning Mass at 9:00am. There will be no 11:00am, 12:30pm or 5:30pm Masses. In the afternoon we invite people to gather in the Church at 2:30pm to watch the Mass being broadcast at 3:00pm from the Phoenix Park. Holy Communion will be distributed during this gathering and it fulfills your Sunday obligation. There will be no 5:30pm Mass.

## The Refurbishment of the Church

**Phase One:** 

The works that will take place in phase one will be in the following order:

• Beginning on 20<sup>th</sup> August the repainting of the Church. Three colour samples marked A, B, C, will be on the back wall and near the Sacred Space. You can write your preference on a card and put it in the box beside the samples. They will be the same colours in both locations. The red at the back of the reredos will stay the same, but it is proposed to lighten the colour of the Church.

At the same time winders will be fitted to the windows so that they can be opened/closed without getting on a chair.

Mass will be at 10:00am on the weekdays as normal, but we may have to use one of the side aisles or the Parish Centre for Masses. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament will take place in the old Parish Meeting Room in the Presbytery for the duration of the works.

- The carpet will go in towards the end of September to allow for rewiring of the sound system.
- The new Altar Furniture will be ordered in September once we have approval from the Diocesan Art and Architecture Commission. As part of our submission we will be looking at were we will place the Chair and the Ambo.

#### Why have the Chair and the Ambo been swapped?

The last time the Church was reordered the Tabernacle was moved from the centre of the Sanctuary to the side, where it is now. Why was this done? The guiding principle comes from the reforms of the Second Vatican Council and is outlined in this article from the General Instruction of the Roman Missal which covers all the norms for the layout of Churches and the celebration of the Sacraments:



#### The Place for the Reservation of the Most Holy Eucharist

314. In accordance with the structure of each church and legitimate local customs, the Most Blessed Sacrament should be reserved in a tabernacle in a part of the church that is truly noble, prominent, readily visible, beautifully decorated, and suitable for prayer.

The one tabernacle should be immovable, be made of solid and inviolable material that is not transparent, and be locked in such a way that the danger of profanation is prevented to the greatest extent possible. Moreover, it is appropriate that, before it is put into liturgical use, it be blessed according to the rite described in the Roman Ritual.

315. It is more in keeping with the meaning of the sign that the tabernacle in which the Most Holy Eucharist is reserved not be on an altar on which Mass is celebrated.

Consequently, it is preferable that the tabernacle be located, according to the judgment of the diocesan Bishop,

Either in the sanctuary, apart from the altar of celebration, in a form and place more appropriate, not excluding on an old altar no longer used for celebration;

Or even in some chapel suitable for the faithful's private adoration and prayer and organically connected to the church and readily visible to the Christian faithful.

I have underlined the particular reasons why the Tabernacle was moved to its current location. When you read the paragraph 314 it speaks about the honour due to the Tabernacle which the beautiful surround and the new Sanctuary Lamp, give our Tabernacle.

The reason for moving the Ambo to the other side of the Sanctuary is that when you look up the Church, the Ambo blocks the Tabernacle. When there are funerals or school/family Masses, the readers often stand in front of the Tabernacle, all of which goes against what is said in article 125 above. However this is a local matter, so you will be asked for your preference and reason.

Next week we will look at the location of the Baptismal Font and also a look to the future as to the type of seating we should have in the Church to meet changing needs in the future.



# Everything is a Love Letter from God

"God has written a precious book, 'whose letters are the multitude of created things present in the universe'. No creature is excluded from this manifestation of God. 'From panoramic vistas to the tiniest living form, nature is a constant source of wonder and awe. It is also a continuing revelation of the divine." (Canadian Bishops' Conference) [LS 85]

Notice what Pope Francis is saying here - that the first Creation is already a special story about God, a precious book in which every page, every creature, is a revelation of the divine Creator. He is saying that God was already in the world from the beginning of its existence, long before



the coming of Jesus into our world at the first Christmas. He believes that Creation itself is a central part of the Christian story. It will be helpful for all of us to get a clearer glimpse of this revelation - that Creation itself is the first love letter from our Parent-God the first Bible, the first glimpse of our divine Mother, her first incarnation. It is an insight we need to grasp if we

are ever to be touched by what our Pope has in his heart for our enlightenment and nourishment.

"Acknowledging the intrinsic value and beauty of creation ... is a major paradigm shift for most Western and cultural Christians," writes Richard Rohr. "We limited God's love and salvation to our own human species and even then to only certain 'chosen' people ... All you have to do today is walk outside and gaze at one leaf, long and lovingly, until you know, really know, that this leaf is a participation in the eternal being of God."
